

Catalyst for Change Scholarship

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

Q: How do I apply for the Catalyst for Change Scholarship?

A: To apply for the Catalyst for Change Scholarship you must have a bachelor's degree from an accredited university with a minimum GPA of 3.0. You must also complete the Catalyst for Change Scholarship application. Scholarship recipients will be selected by the CLU Scholarship Committee.

Q: What is the value of my scholarship?

A: Your scholarship is valued at up to 50% of your total tuition for one master's degree program at Claremont Lincoln University. Tuition at CLU is between \$23,100 - 25,200, depending on your program choice. Aside from the cost of books, there are no additional fees or expenses. If you are selected for the Catalyst for Change Scholarship, you will be notified of the specific dollar amount of your scholarship in your award letter.

Q: How do I receive my scholarship funds?

A: Scholarship funds are applied to your student account in equal disbursements based on your enrollment status each term. Scholarship funds can only be used toward tuition costs and do not carry any cash value.

Q: What if my scholarship doesn't cover my entire cost of tuition?

A: Your scholarship will generally not cover your full program tuition costs. You will need to work with the Office of Student Financial Services to select how you would like to fund the balance of your tuition. Some of the ways students can elect to pay tuition charges include securing student loans through Title IV federal financial aid, making cash payments, applying for private loans through the lender of their choice, employer tuition reimbursement programs, or by finding additional scholarship or grant programs for which they may be eligible. Q: What are the requirements to maintain my scholarship?

A: Scholarship recipients are expected to maintain continuous enrollment and remain in good academic standing. Scholarship recipients who withdraw from the University or who are placed on academic suspension will forfeit the remainder of their scholarship balance.
